- Wisconsin is not a next of kin state, meaning family members are not automatically granted the right to make health care decisions for you.
- Without one, your family may need to go through the legal/ court system for a legal guardian. This can be costly, timeconsuming and stressful.
- It will give you and your family peace of mind.

What is an Advance Directive?


- It is a legal document.
